Advanced Emergency Medical Technician Program

Supplemental Information

- Course Sequence and Delivery. The Advanced Emergency Medical Technician program is a 170 hour course that builds on the Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) curriculum (120 hours classroom instruction and 50 hours of clinical/field). Students will learn advanced life-support interventions such as how to administer IV fluids and some medications used in specific emergency situations. Advanced Emergency Medical Technicians work for ambulance services licensed by the Wisconsin Division of Health, or in healthcare facilities. Components of the program include lecture, skills, laboratory, clinical and field experiences. This program meets state Advanced EMT licensure requirements.
- Clinical and Field Experience. The Advanced EMT program utilizes clinical and field training sites in the Western Technical College area during the program. Although there is a requirement of 50 hours of clinical and field experience, students must meet the State of Wisconsin minimum competencies for each skill and assessment. If a student has not met the required competencies in their required number of hours of clinical and field experience, he/she will have to perform additional clinical and field experience until the competences are met. Note that students are responsible for their own transportation to all clinical sites.
- Training Permit/Background Check. After the Advanced EMT course starts, you will be required
 to apply for an Adv. EMT Training Permit. If you have a positive background check, you will be
 required to obtain official court documentation from the court(s) where the charges originated,
 as well as a driving record abstract from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation and/or your
 state of residence if you have a driving record. You will upload this information electronically and
 submit with your training permit application.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services EMS section will review each application and determine if the individual is eligible for an Adv. EMT Training Permit. In the event you are not issued a training permit from the Wisconsin Department of Health Services EMS section, you will not be eligible to continue in the program. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services EMS section will not process applications prior to the start of class.

- Course Completion. Upon course completion, the student will become eligible to take the Adv. EMT National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) written and practical examinations. Upon successful completion of this exam, the student will then need to apply for state licensure.
- Additional Costs. Each student will be responsible for supplying the following:
 - Uniform as required by Western Technical College for clinical and field experience
 - Transportation costs incurred for travel to clinical sites
 - National Registry Written Exam (\$136.00 subject to change)
 - Wisconsin Practical Exam Testing Fee (\$250.00 subject to change)
- **Body Art and Piercings.** In the Health & Public Safety Division, a student may display no body art or piercing that might be considered offensive. Most employment settings have policies that are generally broad; however, they do reserve the right to deny employment and student

clinical/practicum/fieldwork placement if body art or piercings are found to be offensive to those in that setting.

- The wearing and displaying of jewelry in the health care or public safety setting is generally limited to wrist watches and wedding rings or small non-dangling earrings. The purpose of this limitation is related to infection control, safety and public perception of the employees while they are on duty.
- o If a Western student has significant visible body art and/or piercings, we are unable to guarantee that the student will be able to be placed for the multiple clinical/practicum/fieldwork experiences that most programs require. You may be asked to cover the body art with clothing or dressings or remove the piercings in order to complete your rotation. If your program has a more restrictive policy on body art or piercings, it will be enforced. It is your decision whether or not to enter the program based on the uncertainty of being accepted at those sites.
